Annual General Meeting 2014 – Association for Consumer Rights (ACR) Malta The Association for Consumer Rights Malta (ACR) highlights the need for stronger legislation and law enforcement in emerging online services and product safety

The ACR Annual General Meeting will be held on Saturday 29 March 2014 at Europa House Valletta,

Vice-President Judith Debono welcomed the participants, gving a brief overview of the objectives of the Association The opening address by Hon Helena Dalli, *Minister for Social Dialogue, Consumer Affairs and Civil Liberties*, highlighted the importance of Consumer Rights more particularly with the developments in tehcnology, and the need for empowering consumers while strengthening enforcment measures. She also referred to the the government's initiatives to reform legislation on Consumer Affairs, to be more in line with current developments. Structural reform in the relevant Authorities is also necessary. She congratulated ACR for its initiatives to improve consumer protection and empowerment

In the first part of the AGM, Keynote Speaker Geoffrey Bezzina, Director, Consumer Affairs Unit, Malta, Financial Services Authority gave an informative talk on *Money Matters - Know how to manage your finances better*. This was followed by a discussion and questions and comments from the floor with particular reference to insurance matters and banking transactions

During the second part of the Meeting, the Assembly approved a number of resolutions, which are currently being addressed at European level and which Commisioner Mimica is considering as priorities for the next term, A number of resolutions addressing local situations were also submitted These include:

The concluding address by Hon Dr Paula Mifsud Bonnici, *Shadow Minister for Consumer Affairsonce again* highlighted the need for consumer protection and law enforemennt.
